Returning Officer

Group travel

A seven day visit to Germany by train is planned by RDS Group Travel for 14-20 May next year. Jim Walker will lead a party travelling by Eurostar, Thalys and German inter-city trains to Leipzig, a historic city in the east of the country.

Leipzig is within easy reach of the Erzgebirge mountains along the Czech border and famous cities such as Dresden and Halle, while Berlin is now just an hour or so away to the north by fast train.

Attractions of Leipzig itself include Auerbachs Keller, the beer cellar which was frequented by the famous writer Johann Wolfgang von Goethe, and the massive monument to the battle fought just outside the city by Napoleon on his way back from Moscow in 1813.

More modern attractions include one of the largest rail stations in Europe and a good tram system. Work is in progress on a north-south rail tunnel under the city.

Harwich-Hook

Stena Line has announced, following a review, that it will be withdrawing its high speed ship Stena Discovery from the Harwich-Hook of Holland route early in 2007 and upgrading the two other vessels.

They have not specified how long the other vessels will take to complete the journey, currently done in only three hours 50 minutes.

It is likely there will be a day crossing and a night crossing, however. As chairman of the European Passengers' Federation Trevor Garrod has written again to Pim de Lange, Stena's North Sea director, expressing our concern while understanding the company's reasons for this change. Trevor has urged him to continue to work with the train operators on either side of the water to ensure that attractive rail/sea/ rail fares and facilities continue.

Stratford International

There are fears that Eurostars will not call at this new station when the second and final stage of the high speed line to the Channel Tunnel is opened in December 2007.

Trevor Garrod has therefore written to Eurostar's managing director, and to train operator ONE, pointing out that a lot of public money has been spent on this facility and the travelling public, especially in East London and East Anglia, will expect it to be open from day one.

If it is not possible for a fixed link, such as a Docklands Light Railway extension or a travelator, to be built by the end of 2007, then a dedicated bus shuttle could be operated to and from Stratford main line station.

Eurostar is planning to alternate between non-stop trains to the Continent and trains which will call at two stations in south east England.

Euro training

In July Trevor Garrod gave a presentation for the third year running to the European Training Centre for Railways in Bruges, Belgium.

The two-week seminar brought together 45 managers from train operators and infrastructure companies throughout Europe.

Trevor explained the aspirations of the European Passengers' Federation (of which Railfuture is a founder member) for easy rail travel and for rail to attain a greater share of the transport market.

He also pointed to the challenges faced by would-be travellers in finding out about services, buying tickets and making reservations.

Some participants suggested a European Rail website to help potential customers find out about, and book, their tickets but Trevor stressed the need for properly trained call centre staff to help international travellers.
